The agency proposal follows:

Summary

The proposed amendment to *N.J.A.C. 12:235-1.6* would establish the 2012 maximum workers' compensation benefit rates for temporary disability, permanent total disability, permanent partial disability and dependency under the Workers' Compensation Law.

Because a 60-day comment period has been provided in this notice of proposal, this notice is excepted from the rulemaking calendar requirement pursuant to *N.J.A.C. 1:30-3.3(a)5*.

Social Impact

The proposed amendment will ensure that payments to workers' compensation recipients entitled to maximum benefits will increase in line with the upward trend of wages in the State's economy, thus preserving the real purchasing power of their benefits.

Economic Impact

The proposed amendment will increase from \$ 792.00 to \$ 810.00, the weekly benefit rate received by individuals eligible for the maximum weekly benefit rate for temporary disability, permanent total disability, permanent partial disability and dependency under the Workers' Compensation Law. The 2012 maximum benefit rate represents a 2.3 percent increase in the current maximum benefit rate.

Federal Standards Statement

The proposed amendment does not contain any standards or requirements that exceed standards or requirements imposed by Federal law. The amendment decreases benefit rates to individuals. As a result, an explanation or analysis of the proposed amendment pursuant to Executive Order No. 27 (1994) is not required.

Jobs Impact

The proposed amendment will have no impact on jobs in New Jersey. The Department does not anticipate an increase or decrease in jobs as a result of this amendment.

Agriculture Industry Impact

The proposed amendment will have no impact on the agriculture industry.

Regulatory Flexibility Statement

The proposed amendment does not impose any reporting, recordkeeping or compliance requirements on small businesses as that term is defined in the Regulatory Flexibility Act, *N.J.S.A. 52:14B-16* et seq. The proposed amendment increases benefit rates to individuals. Thus, a regulatory flexibility analysis is not required.

Smart Growth Impact

The proposed amendment will not have any impact on the achievement of smart growth or the implementation of the State Development and Redevelopment Plan.

Housing Affordability Impact Analysis

The proposed amendment will not evoke a change in the average costs associated with housing. The basis for this finding is that the proposed amendment pertains to the statutorily mandated annual adjustment to the maximum workers' compensation benefit rates and does not pertain to housing.

Smart Growth Development Impact Analysis

The proposed amendment will not evoke a change in the housing production within Planning Areas 1 or 2, or within designated centers, under the State Development and Redevelopment Plan. The basis for this finding is that the pro-

posed amendment pertains to the statutorily mandated annual adjustment to the maximum workers' compensation benefit rates and does not pertain to housing production, either within Planning Areas 1 or 2, or within designated centers.

Full text of the proposal follows (additions indicated in boldface **thus**; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]):

12:235-1.6 Maximum workers' compensation benefit rates

(a) In accordance with the provisions of *N.J.S.A. 34:15-12(a)*, the maximum workers' compensation benefit rate for temporary disability, permanent total disability, permanent partial disability and dependency is hereby promulgated as being [\$ 792.00] **\$ 810.00** per week.

(b) The maximum compensation shall be effective as to injuries occurring in the calendar year [2011] **2012**.
